## NOTE TO PARENTS

Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) are plants, animals and diseases that are not native to Montana and can harm our environment and economy. AIS populations can reproduce quickly and spread rapidly because there are no natural predators or competitors to keep them in check. Once established, there are few if any means to control AIS in natural waterbodies.

You can help protect our waters for future generations. CLEAN off aquatic plants, animals, and mud from watercraft, motor, trailer, and equipment before leaving water access. DRAIN water from watercraft, motor, bilge, bladder tanks, livewell, and portable bait containers before leaving water access. DRY everything or wipe with a towel to remove small species not easily seen.







Montana's rivers and lakes also are great for boating and fishing!
